After receiving a law degree from the Royal University of Law and Economics in Phnom Penh, Kalyan worked as a domestic violence intervention officer at Daughters of Cambodia, an NGO in Phnom Penh. She was then awarded a one-year fellowship to study gender and women's studies at Bowdoin College in the US. Following her time at Bowdoin, Kalyan won a highly competitive Civil Society Leadership Award from the Open Society Foundation for a two-year master's degree program in social work at Columbia University. Upon receiving her MSW and returning to Cambodia, Kalyan worked as Project Coordinator at the NGO Rainbow Community Kampuchea. In April 2017, she began work as Director of Selection and Community Relations at Teach for Cambodia, which partners with the Ministry of Education in Cambodia. Kalyan has also worked as a consultant for Oxfam Great Britain and UNICEF. Kalyan has experience in both the public and private sectors and is committed to using her background in social work to improve education, to fight against domestic violence and gender inequality, and to raise awareness of gender issues.
